MADD PRESENTATION - Thurs. March 12

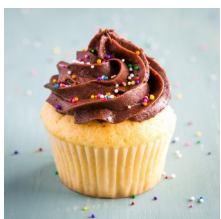
Our grade 7&8 students will have the opportunity to participate in a Mothers Against Drunk Driving presentation on Thursday, March 12 in the afternoon.
